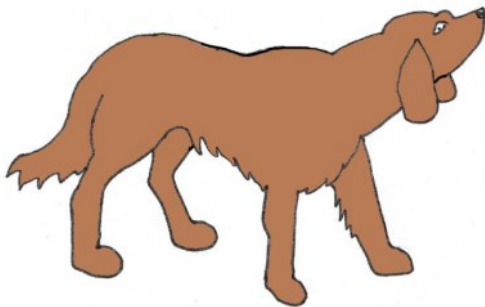

“Will you play football with us, Dad?” says Sam.

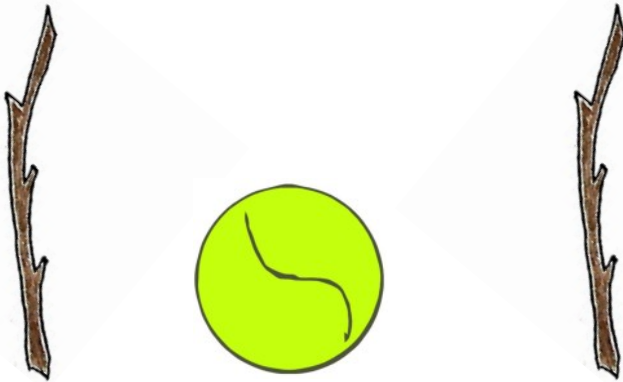
“Yes. Says Tom. “Will you play?” he says to his wife.

The children are glad to have a drink.

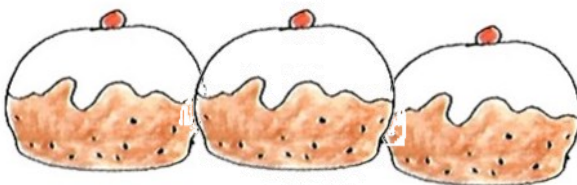
“Would you like some milk?” says the man
