It can take two months for a caterpillar to get big and fat.

When the caterpillar is big and fat, it stops eating.

It turns into a pupa.

Inside the pupa something happens.

The caterpillar turns from a caterpillar into a butterfly.

This can take from a few days to a few months to happen.

After a few weeks, a butterfly comes out from the pupa.

It rests for a while, its wings harden and then it flies away.

It goes to look for somewhere to lay its eggs!

Pam was very glad to have found the caterpillar eggs.


"Mother," she said, "Can I keep them in a box? I want to see them grow."

Then they started to eat. Pam had to get new leaves for the hungry caterpillars.


She got more leaves and more leaves until one day, a caterpillar made a pupa.
