Chiffchaff

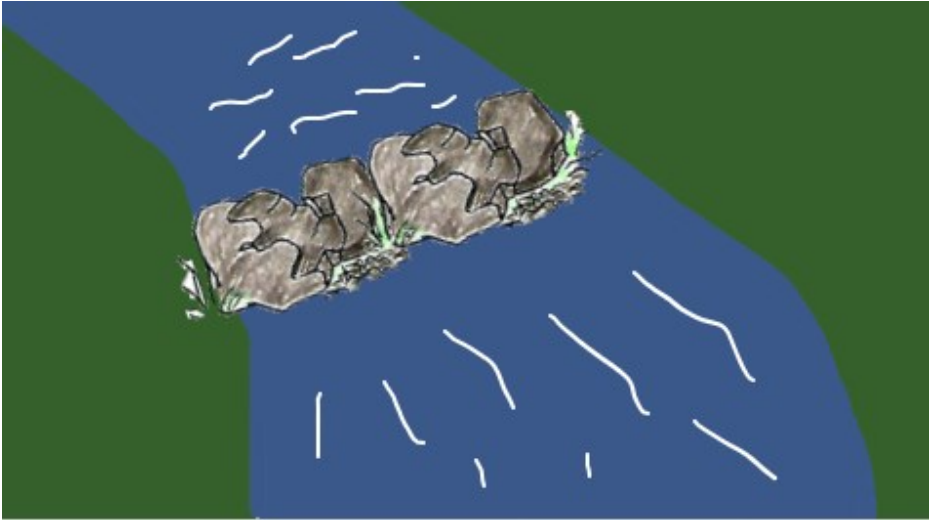
They do not see many birds today, but they can hear them.
