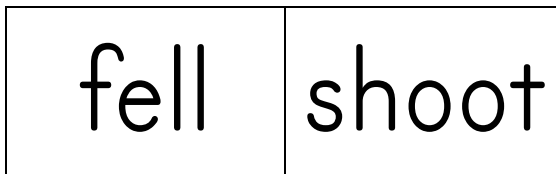

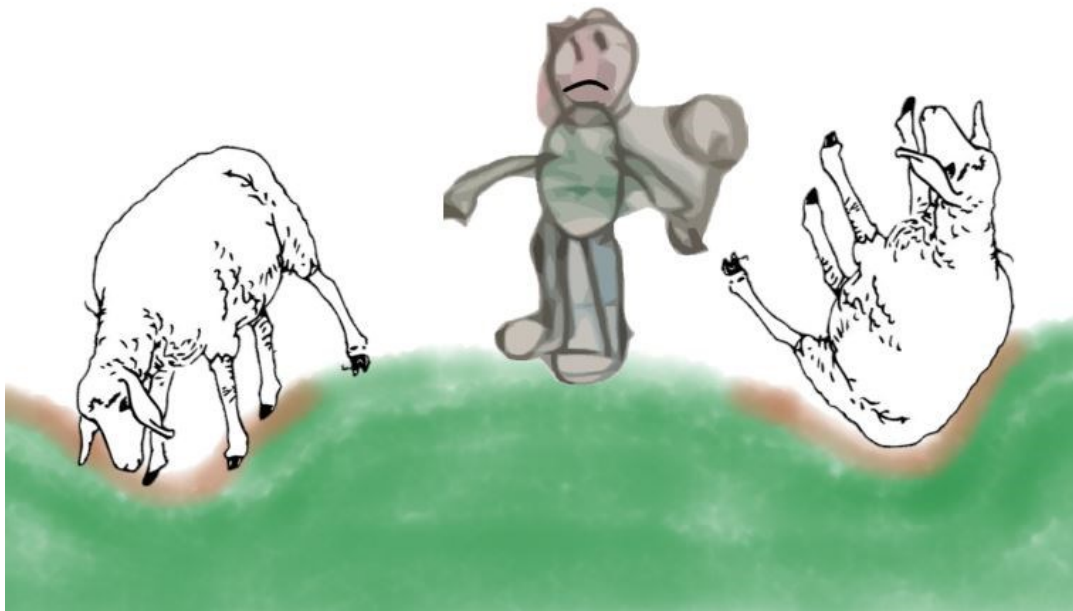
Introduction:

a pit.

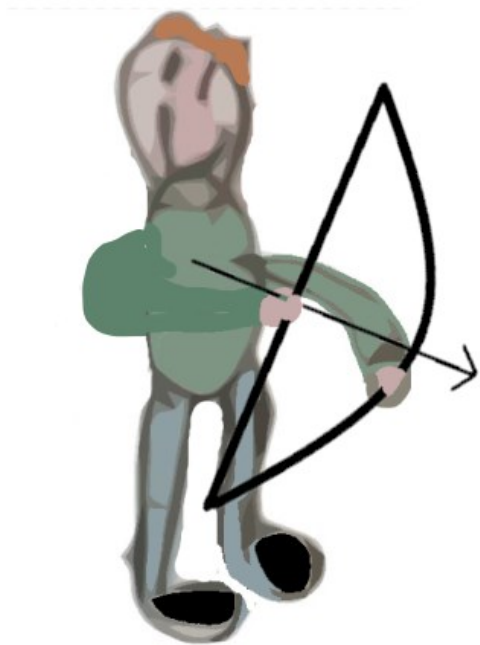


Jack will get the rabbits.

get a rabbit.



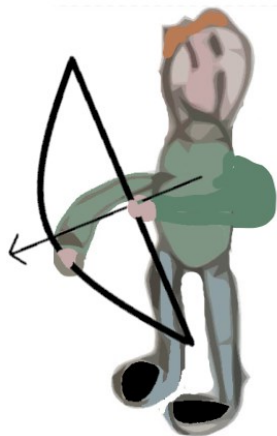
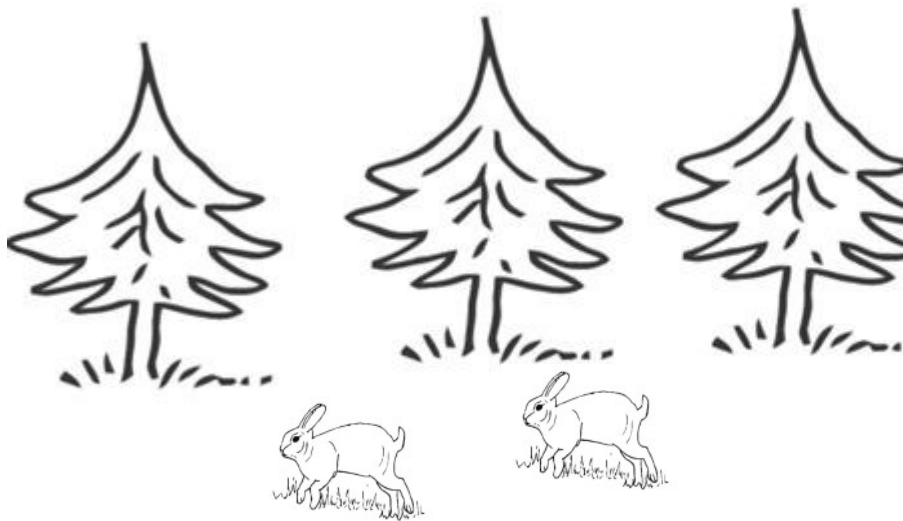
Jack will shoot the rabbits.

Can Jack shoot a rabbit?

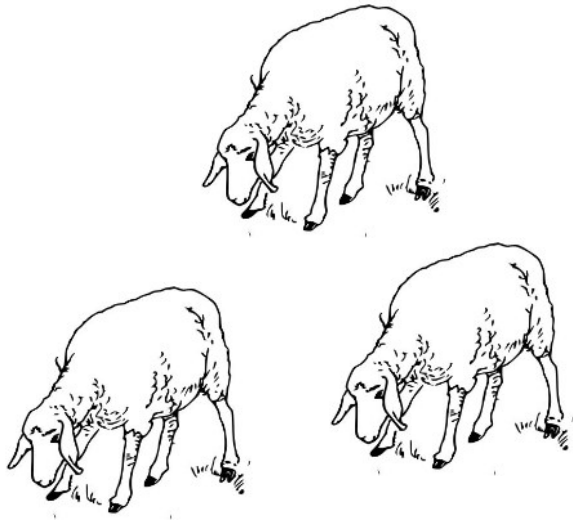
No. The rabbits run and jump.
