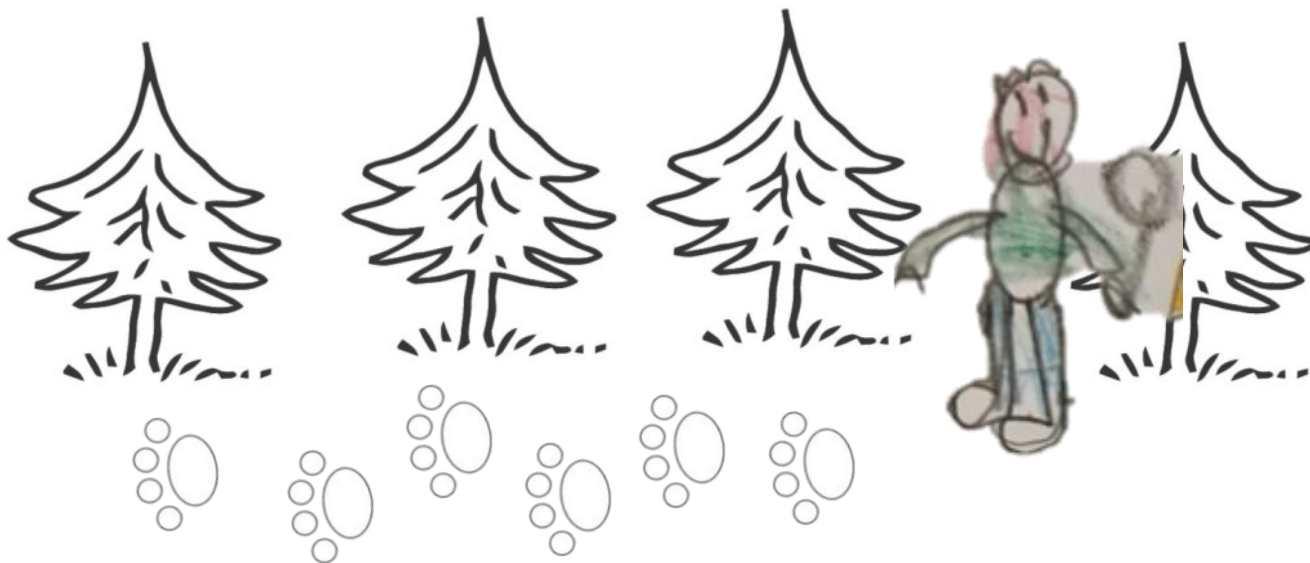

Jack will track a buck.

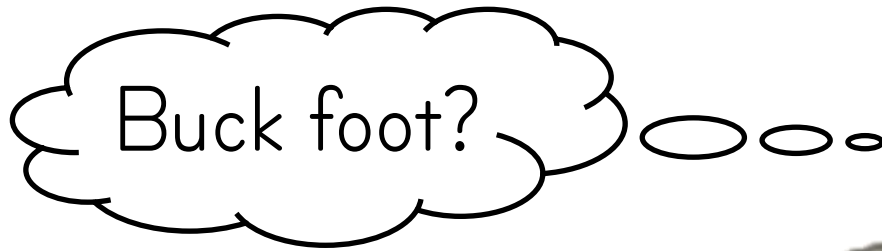


It is not black.

Run Jack! Big bad fox!



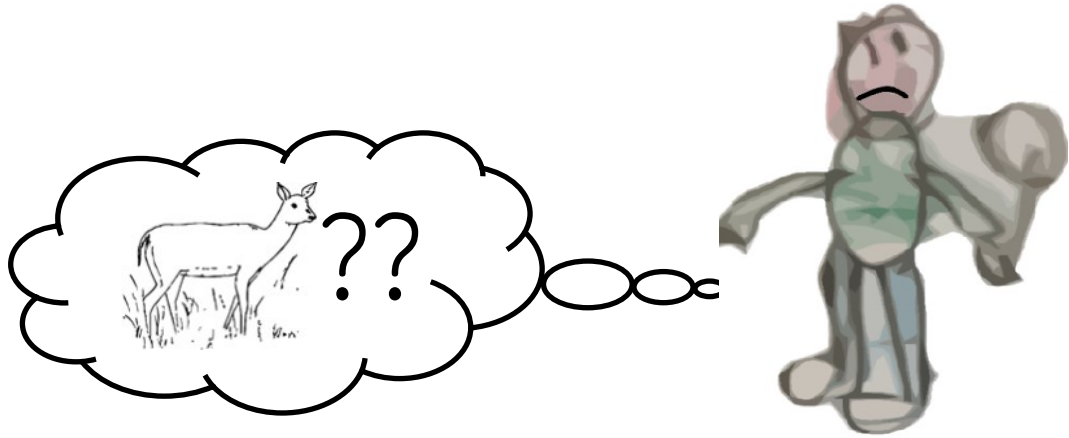
Jack runs up the hill to look in
