Many adverbs end with the letters 'ly'.

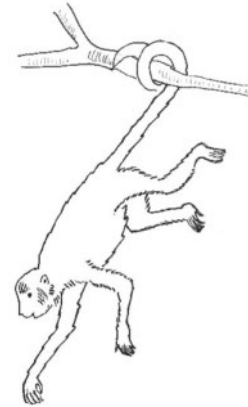
