Introduction:

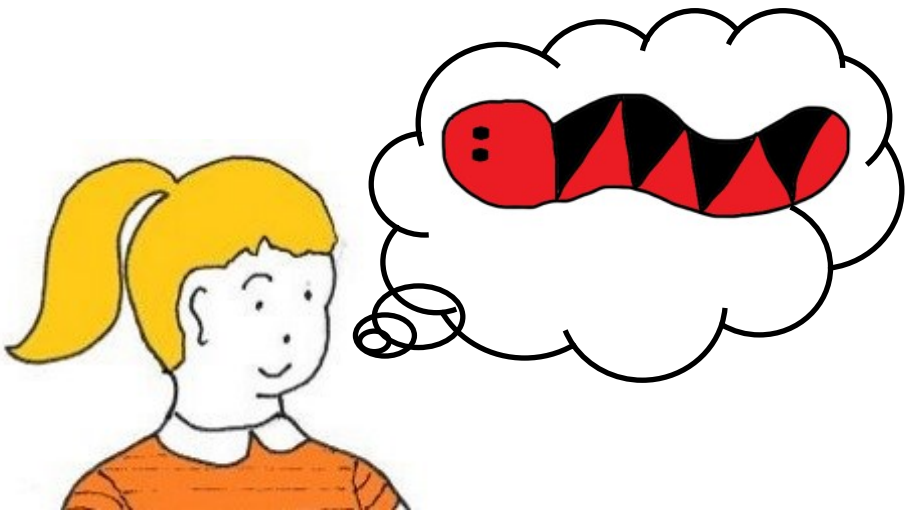
Pam is making a cake for her friend's birthday. Let us find out what happens!

Pam will bake a big cake.

The cake is for Jane.

It will be a big cake. It is in the **shape** of a snake.

It will be black and red.



shape

The cake needs six eggs. Pam must go to the shop to get six eggs.

The eggs are in an egg box.

Pam must not drop the eggs, or they will **crack**.

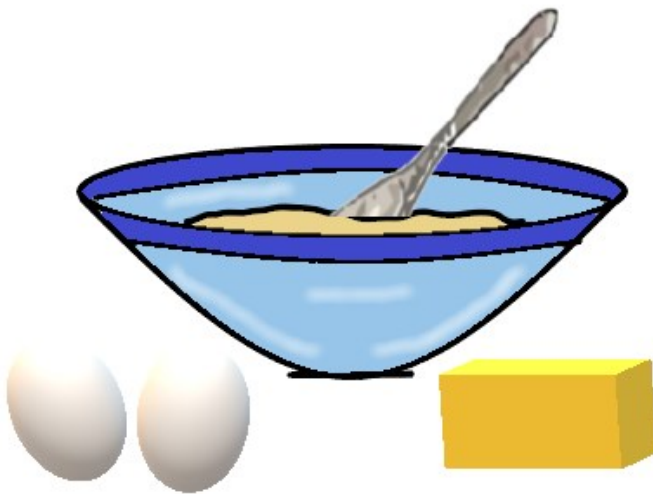


crack

Pam brings the eggs back from the shop, Mum helps Pam to make the cake.

Pam **mixes** it up with a big spoon and puts it in a tin.

Then she bakes the cake.



mixes

When the cake is made, Pam lets it cool. Then Pam takes it to Jane.

Pam **rushes** to see Jane.

Pam must not be late.

Jane is at the gate. She sees Pam with the cake.



rushes

Jane lets Pam have a bit of the cake.

Jane has some cake and Pam has some cake.

“Yum,” says Jane. This is a good cake.
