

Tom, Pam and Sam are going on a long walk up into the hills. They each have a big rucksack with lunch and lots of drink.


Tom, Sam and Pam take a rest on a bank and have a drink. Then, off they go up into the hills. A man on a blue bike waves to them as he rides by.

Sam and Pam get on top of the cave and look for a hole.


'Here is a hole,' cries Pam. 'It is a big hole.'
