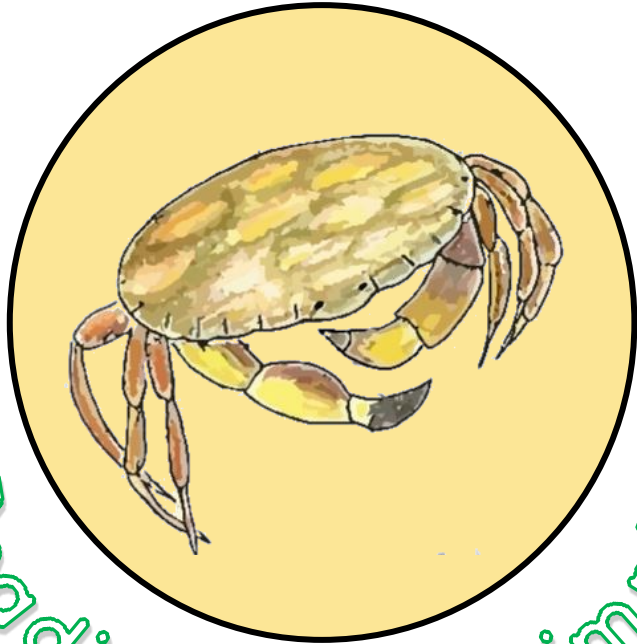
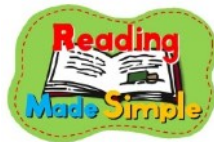

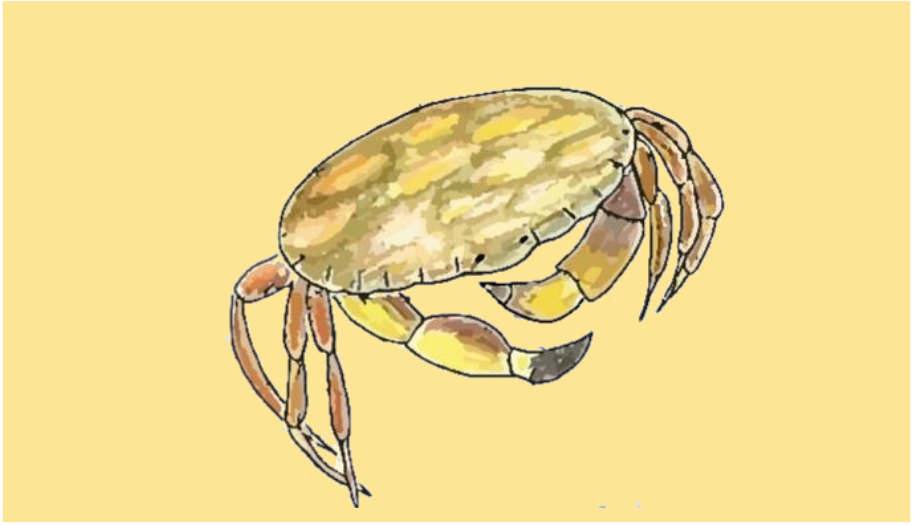

off up the sand.





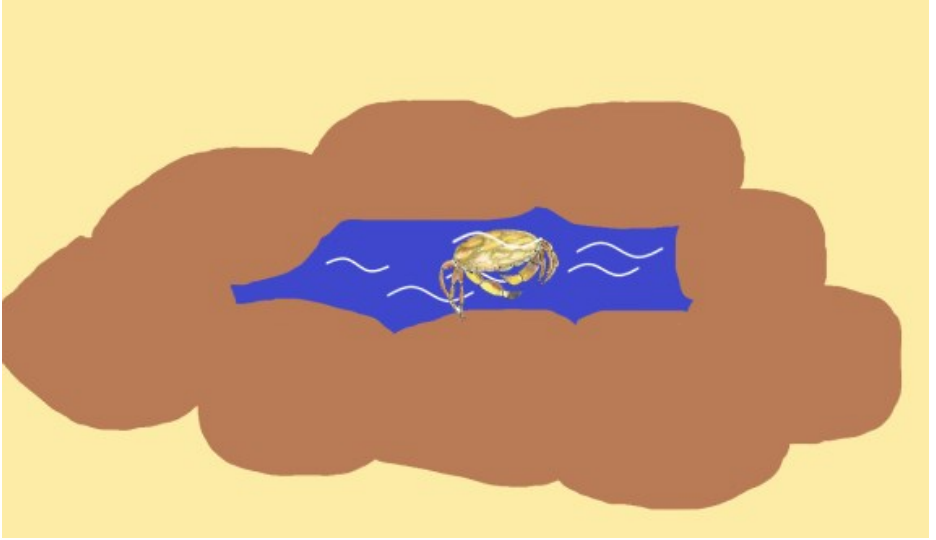
Gran can help.
